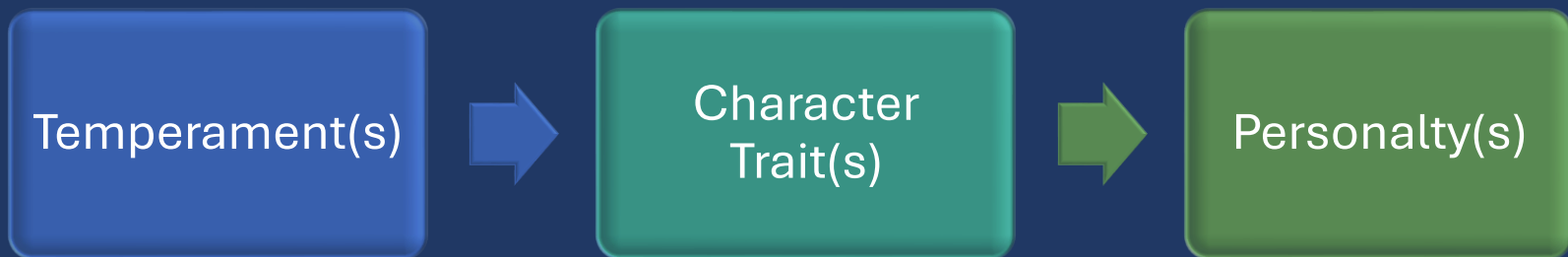
As research here at eonteous, and outside continues, we will adapt and update if any new conclusive information emerges. We hope this provides clarity.

Purpose

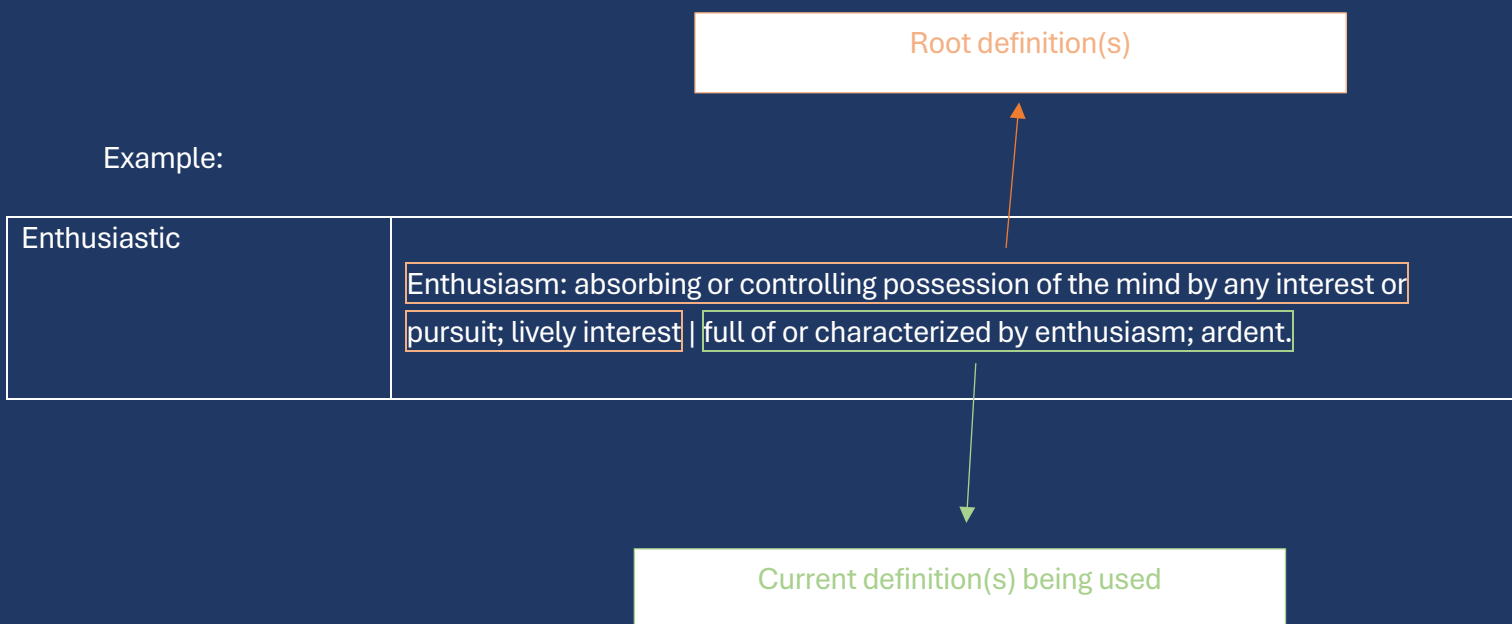
